



Paper I covers Journalism Reporting, Structure and Types of News Reports, News Writing for TV serial and TV commercial, Fundamentals of Good Writing etc. Paper II covers the history and evolution of communication, growth of



print media, genres of television, format of radio etc. Paper III covers the history of journalism, world journalism, origin of and growth of Indian Journalism, history of Malayalam journalism, press laws, code of ethics in journalism etc.

The course also provides practical sessions for the students. For the Certificate Course, there is 10 days internship (60hrs)and for Diploma Course, there is 30 days (90hrs)internship at different media related institutions such as Malayala Manorama, Deshabhimani, Mangalam, The New Indian Express etc. This helps the students to understand the practicality in this field and the jobs done by a journalist. This also helps the students to understand the happenings in a News Bureau. The classes were conducted on alternate days from Monday to Friday from 8.30 am to 9.30 am. The classes were taken by two resource persons, Mr. Naduvattom Satyaselan from Mangalam daily and Mr. Raju Anicadu from Surya TV Reporter.

The class for this academic year was started in the month of September. About 34 students were enrolled for certificate course and 4 students for diploma course. We had classes on alternate days in the morning. Exams were conducted on time and we got chance to go for the 10 day internship and the students done their internship at various institutions such as Deshabhimani, SGC TV Aruvithura, Malayala Manorama, Mangalam, Deepika etc. This internship helped the students to play the role of a journalist, news reporter, news editor etc. This helped the students understand what the happenings inside a news bureau are.

This course was delightfully fruitful one for the students as this was a new experience and an advancement in their career. This improved their practical skills and quality. This made the student one step ahead in her qualification within a short period of time. This course is a way to enhance the student's portfolio.

The course structure consisted of 30 lecture hours dealing with various topics crucial in moulding the students' entrepreneurial capabilities. These topics included the role of entrepreneurship in the nation's economic development, Interpersonal skills critical to sustain in the field of business, personality development, relevance of time management, and the importance of maintaining a positive attitude towards life.

The course had many interactive sessions where the students described their fears and confusion about being an entrepreneur. The teachers tried to motivate them by instilling confidence in them and making them realise the world's competencies. They explained the success stories of many women entrepreneurs who have taken the road not taken by many. The course also had a session providing information regarding different funding agencies that support Medium and Small scale businesses.

The significant objectives of the course were

- (i) To develop an entrepreneurial motivation among students
- (ii) To help them identify their potential
- (iii) To help the students acquire basic managerial skills
- (iv) To provide information regarding available support systems to obtain seed capital
- (v) To instil confidence among students by depicting success stories of different entrepreneurs around us.





There were 91 students in the batch, out of which all appeared for the exam and there was a 100 percent pass. The teacher in charge of the academic session was Mrs Shalini Thomas.





Report of Certificate Course: Guidance and Counselling for Everyday Life (2018-19)

Guidance and counselling is a certificate course offered by the Department of Sociology. The aim of the course is to help the students recognize the role of guidance and counselling in mental health and also to introduce them to the scope of the guidance and counselling as a career option. Guidance and counselling is a significant discipline that is becoming one of the most respectable and rewarding professions in India. Applicants in this discipline can work in areas such as community and voluntary organizations, departments of the central government, the police, etc. People may also get career offers in both public as well as private sectors in a range of employment such as publishing, HR, retail management, market and policy research, as well as career guidance and educational psychology.

All the interested students are admitted into this course. Students from any department can choose guidance and counselling as their certificate course. This course would give clear background about the importance of guidance and counselling in helping individuals to discover their educational, vocational, and psychological potentialities.

The syllabus of the course is arranged in such a way that the students could grasp every main concept and idea related to guidance and counselling. The syllabus contains three units: Unit I (Concept of guidance)unit II (Career Guidance Work & Mental Health)unit III(Psychometric Methods and Techniques for Guidance and counselling - Quantitative Techniques)unit IV (Counselling approaches). Unit I covers topics such as meaning and principles of guidance, need and importance of guidance, scope of guidance etc. Unit II covers meaning of work, meaning of compensation, work and leisure characteristics and need for mental health etc. Unit III covers psychological tests, intelligence tests, interest inventories, aptitude test, achievement test etc. Unit IV covers cognitively oriented counselling approaches, trait and factor oriented counselling approaches, conditions influencing counselling etc.

The classes began in the month of August. 30hrs is duration of course, with around 5hrs in a month. Extra class hours were utilized for teaching guidance and counselling. The classes were taken by trained psychologist, Ms.Karthika Elizabeth with 80 % contact hours and rest





20% with assignments and seminars (in and off-class mode). A total number of 113 students attended this year's certificate course.

Students who successfully complete this course are provided a certificate by the college. guidance and counselling as a certificate course along with a degree can ensure better in professional life in the future.

Keeping this in mind, the Department of Chemistry offers a certificate course in Soaps and Detergents. This programme is of 30 hours duration comprising 25 hours theory classes and 5 hours hands on experiments session. We started it from the academic year 2017-2018. The number of participants during the year 2018-2019 was 32. Ms. Merlin Thomas was the teacher in charge of this course. The course started on 2/11/2018 and ended on 11/3/19 during the academic year 2018-2019.

- To get the students hands-on training in soap and detergent making, it can be a stepping stone to entrepreneurship in the soap and detergent industry.
- To make soaps and detergents without adding any unwanted chemicals.

The attainment of course outcome was evaluated by an assessment test and also the students were asked to make soaps on their own and displayed.



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



Certificate course on Ornamental Fish Breeding Culture and Management

Ornamental fish breeding culture is a prospective business due to the high demand for these fishes. The increasing demand for aquarium fishes gradually paved the avenue towards global trade of ornamental fishes. Generally, the exotic fish dominate the Indian market and more than 250 varieties have been recorded from the domestic market. More than 200 species of these freshwater fish are bred in different parts of India by the ornamental fish breeders and aquarium hobbyists.

Upholding this demand the Department of Zoology offers a certificate programme on Ornamental fish breeding culture and management for the undergraduate students. The students were taught about the scope of the ornamental fish sector, how they can become entrepreneurs in this area. They have visited various fish breeding centres and farms. They were taught to breed guppy and fighter fish along with the steps in setting up aquarium units. Thirty students from III DC Zoology and twenty students from II DC zoology participated in this course during 2018-19.

Ornamental fish keeping and its propagation has been an interesting activity for many, which provide not only aesthetic pleasure but also financial openings. About 600 ornamental fish species have been reported worldwide from various aquatic environments. Indian waters possess a rich diversity of ornamental fish, with over 100 indigenous varieties, in addition to a similar number of exotic species that are bred in captivity

The objective of the certificate course in ornamental fish breeding, culture and management was to introduce students to the area of ornamental fish breeding culture practices. Summary report of UBUNTU

2018-2019

The Department of Computer Science conducted UBUNTU courses with a duration of 30 hours for each course. After the course completion, an exam was conducted and students were passed with high marks and issued a certificate for course completion. The main objective of this course is to make students self dependent in computer programming and computer technology, so that students can make their career in the computer technology field.

In 2018-2019 total 39 students attended all certificate courses. An external IT expert Mr. Naveen who took classes for our students. The classes started in January and finished in February. An examination was conducted to assess the progress. All the students completed the course meritoriously and certificates were awarded to them.

This course introduces the student to the Linux Operating system with particular emphasis on command line tools, utilities and shell scripting. The student will learn and apply the various commands and utilities related to file system management, process management, program development and data processing. In addition the student will learn about shell concepts and become proficient in the use of shell features such as command line editing and learn and apply Unix concepts such as pipes and filters.

On completion of this course the student should be able to:

- Identify and use UNIX/Linux utilities to create and manage simple file processing operations, organise directory structures with appropriate security, and develop shell scripts to perform more complex tasks.
- Effectively use the UNIX/Linux system to accomplish typical personal, office, technical, and software development tasks.
- Monitor system performance and network activities.
- Effectively use software development tools including libraries, preprocessors, compilers, linkers, and make files.
- Comprehend technical documentation, prepare simple readable user documentation and adhere to style guidelines.

CERTIFICATE COURSE IN BANKING AND FINANCE 2018-19

With a view to familiarise the students with the basic concepts and practical aspects of banking, the Department of Commerce continued the one year certificate course on 'Banking Theory and Practice'. The syllabus was designed to move from introducing the fundamentals of banking system to specific focus on the recent trends and innovations in banking. Apart from the steroetyped paper-pen courses, sufficient focus was laid on improvising the acquaintance with digitalisation in banking sector by means of providing hands-on training on internet banking website and mobile application. In the context of changing scenario of the Indian banking sector, the course was oriented towards professionally mentoring them to facilitate easier adaptation to banking profession. Moreover, the course was expected to equip students to emerge as competent professionals in financial markets, stock exchanges and corporate scenarios. Hence, there was a compilation of both theory and practice in banking, along with personality development of the students.

The academic year 2018-19 had a batch of 36 students, who were provided admission solely on merit basis. The batch included students from both arts and science background, who were enthusiastic to learn about banking in the present era. The guidance of Prof. Jipin V. Jimmy who had ample practical experience in the banking industry added on to the blend of theory and practice in the course. The sessions were handled by 8 teachers focusing on the origin and evolution of banks, credit creation, nationalisation banker-customer relations, the scope of hi tech banking and so on. Periodic assessment tests were conducted to assess the level of comprehension of students.

In order to enrich the application level knowledge of students, an official visit was organised to South house Bank. Students got an opportunity to understand the use of different forms

(cheque, withdrawal slip, DD) and the manner of using them, which is an ignorant aspect for most of the graduates. An interactive session with the bank staff was arranged to clarify their concerns regarding banking career and practice.

The course concentrated on developing the analytical and critical skills of participants by means of interactive assignments, presentations and group discussions. Along with concrete theoretical focus, personality development measures were also implemented by the course team by providing career guidance and preparations for interview. Examination was conducted for students, which had 86.11% attendance. The participants scored well for both theory and practical assessments.


Report of Certificate course on Open Office 2018-19

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

With the introduction of Project work with the UG curriculum, every student has to study some real-life problem and submit a scientific report at the end of their UG programme for successful completion. Before performing any such study, it is inevitable to have an introduction to the Scientific procedure for identifying and dealing with real-life problems. Many of these studies are quantitative. Statistical analysis has become an integral part of any study. While dealing with large data sets or exploiting recent statistical tools, it is tedious or sometimes impossible to do statistical analysis manually. Thorough knowledge of Statistical tools and software has become inevitable in the current research and decision-making process. There are many software available with statistical tools; some are proprietary and some are Free software. Most of the studies in the UG programme involve only essential Statistical tools.

The Certificate course is intended to provide you with the basics of Research Methodology and an introduction to Statistical software through PSPP, one available accessible under GNU. PSPP has many similarities with the statistical software SPSS, but PSPP is free. One of the significant challenges for anyone to master SPSS is the lack of knowledge about how we could enter the data in SPSS format. PSPP has the same data entry format and procedures as SPSS. Hence those familiar with data entry in PSPP can handle data entry in SPSS. Hence with experience in PSPP, one can master SPSS.


