WALK WITH A SCHOLAR (WWS)

Walk with a Scholar scheme arranges specialized mentoring programmes for students in under graduate programmes in Arts, Science and Commerce and also guidance for their future. The scheme introduces the idea of mentoring and builds on the concept of mentor as a guide and friend.

Walk with a Scholar of our college is functioning under a coordinator and 10 internal mentors where 60 students are selected from various departments and given specialized training through internal mentoring and external mentoring. As part of the motivational visit sanctioned by the Department of Collegiate Education, second year WWS students together with three faculty members visited CIFT Ernakulam NIT Calicut, IIM Calicut and CUSAT from 21 – 23 January 2019.

SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME (SSP)

Scholar Support Programme, part of new initiatives in Higher Education initiated by the department of Higher Education Govt. Of Kerala aims at importing personalized additional support to needy students through internal and external mentoring sessions, study materials, additional lectures, question banks, interactive sessions and web based modes. NSS

Mr. Sreekumar P K one of the official janitors of Kottayam Municipality inaugurated this year activities on 6th August 2018. A 7 day special camp Sukrutham 2018 was held from 21st to 27th December at Maria Bhavan English Medium School, Kumarakom. NSS Volunteers and staff collected miscellaneous items and scrap from more than 300 families. By selling those, Rs. 58,000/- was collected for Sahapadickoru Snehaveedu Project. Our volunteers participated in the construction of two houses at Kannadichal and Appithara during the camp, A survey was conducted in 4 colonies in 4 wards of Kumarakom. 400 families were visited in 3 days. A Street Play with the message Green Village, Clean Village were performed at St. Mary's Malankara Church. In a land of 29 cents near to the college volunteers are engaged in organic farming. We have planted tapioca, plantain and vegetables. Almost all the students of the college were involved in the relief activities under the guidance of NSS Unit. NSS Volunteers and other students distributed food packets, cleaned houses, dispensaries, schools and roads as part of flood relief activities. Every Friday we collect food packets and distribute to the members of Abhayabhavan.
