The department of Commerce BCM College Kottayam conducted a webinar on the topic 'safe and healthy overseas education' as part of the VYKHARI, the annual lecture series of BCM College started with the Diamond Jubilee of the

college in 2015. The resource person for the webinar was Dr. Jomis John, professor Confederation College, Ontario, Canada. The webinar started at sharp 9:30 am on 18th September 2021 through Google meet. Dona Mariya of 3rd DC computer application and Lakshmi Parvathy of 2nd DC Taxation hosted the programme. Dr. VS Jose, department head of self financing B.com computer application welcomed all to the lecture and told that the number of students opting for overseas education is increasing and the topic is so relevant in that case. He started with the famous quote 'And when you want something, all the universe conspires in helping you to achieve it', from the book The Alchemist.

After a short self-introduction he discussed the fundamental difference between a college and a university especially in Canada. He told that programs in universities are mostly academic oriented whereas the colleges are career oriented. While talking he emphasized the need of choosing proper course by understanding Canadian job market. He told about some emerging trends like tech business which is a combination of AI and IT. 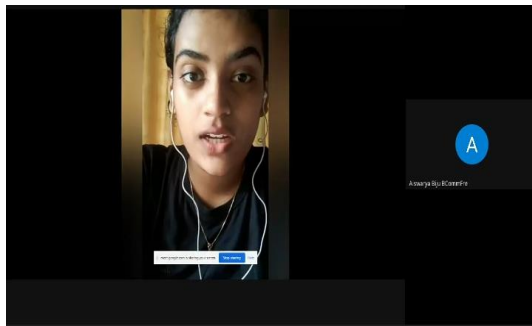

a) INDIAN ECONOMY IN THE WAKE OF COVID LIKE PANDEMIC

The Department of Commerce of BCM College conducted the 8th edition of lecture series on 21st June 2021 at 11am in honour of our former principals Rev. Dr. Sr.Karuna SVM and Prof. Josephina Simon. The programme began with prayer song by Kumari. Merlin Shaji. The welcome speech was delivered by Prof. Jipin V. Jimmy HOD of Commerce Department. The presidential address was given by Dr. Stephy Thomas the principal of BCM College Kottayam. He told that the initiative of food security bill by Prof. K V Thomas sir enabled governments to ensure adequate food to all, thus reduced poverty. He shared his personal experience and memories with our former principals Rev. Dr. Sr. Karuna and Prof. Josephina Simon.

Inaugural address was given by Prof. K V Thomas on the topic “ Indian Economy in the wake of Covid like pandemics”. He was a professor in Chemistry at Sacred Heart College Thevara. He was a member of Lok Sabha from 1984-96. He also represented Ernakulam constituency in Parliament during 2009- 2019. He was the Minister of State in the Ministry of Consumer

Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, during 2nd UPA government. He also served as the Minister for Excise and Tourism, and Minister for Tourism and Fisheries between 2001 and 2004 in the government of Kerala.



He visited BCM College in 2002 along with his beloved wife in connection with a tourism project. According to his speech, Covid-19 pandemic is something which has a great impact on the economic status of the country. On 13th April 2021, India became the 1st country to report over 4 lakhs cases. He pointed out the impacts of covid pandemic all over the economy. He told that there was a pre-pandemic slowdown in the economy. The reasons for this are

Demonetization, GST and some of the government decisions. According to him, Lockdown was an unprepared decision and it adversely affected the economy which leads to unemployment, food security etc. He also said that stock markets in India, aviation in the tourism industry, telecom industry, pharmaceuticals etc. were the areas which had huge impacts to pandemic situation. Fortunately, Agriculture which is considered as the backbone of India, survived. He suggested that the benefits of telecom industry should be available in rural areas and the farmers should be protected by providing adequate remuneration. He concluded his speech by saying that we should take a positive stand and things would change. He also cleared the doubts of the students related to this topic.


The key note address was done by Rev. Fr. Philmon Kalathra, secretary to the corporate educational agency of colleges. He told the impact of covid situation on people from his real life experiences. He thanked Thomas sir for spending his precious time with us.

Dr. V S Jose, HOD of Commerce (SF) delivered the felicitation speech. Prof. Josephina Simon former principal delivered the reply speech. She shared her beautiful experiences, when she was the principal of BCM College. She also appreciated the efforts of Commerce association to conduct lecture series in

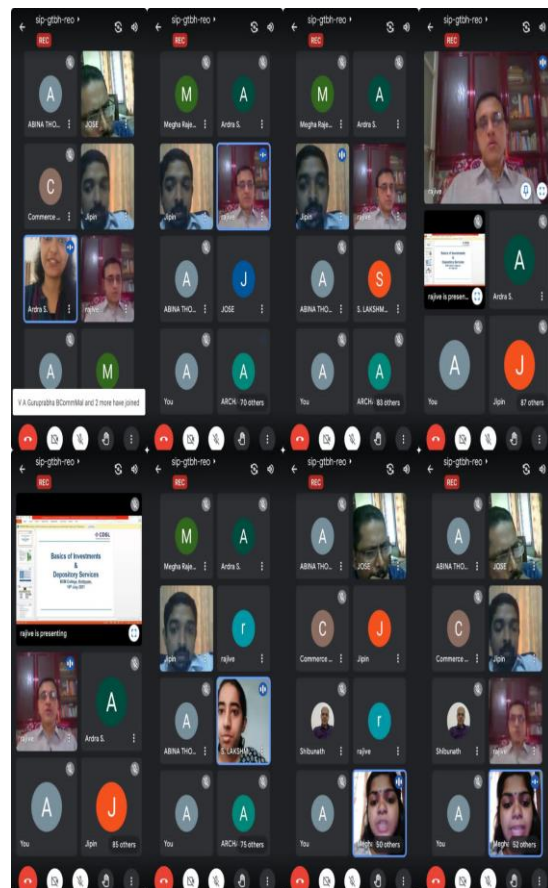

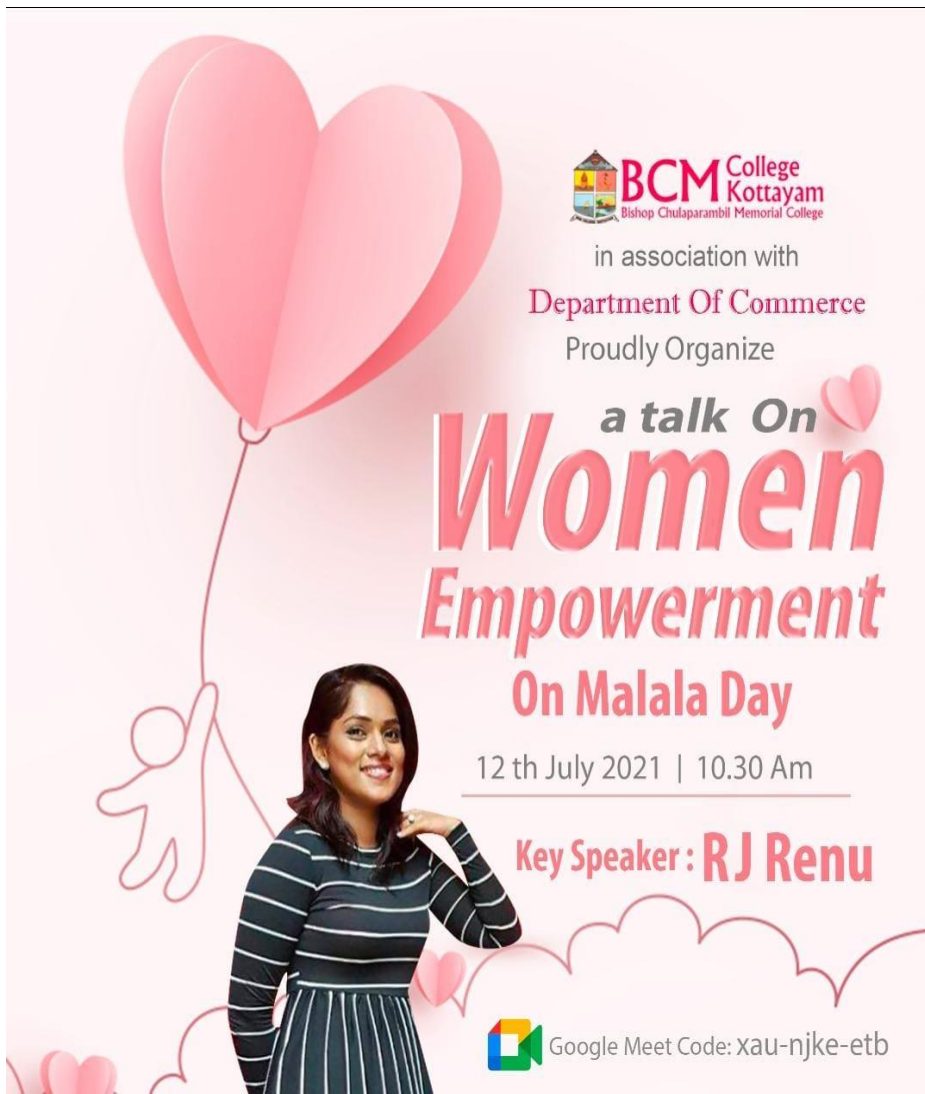

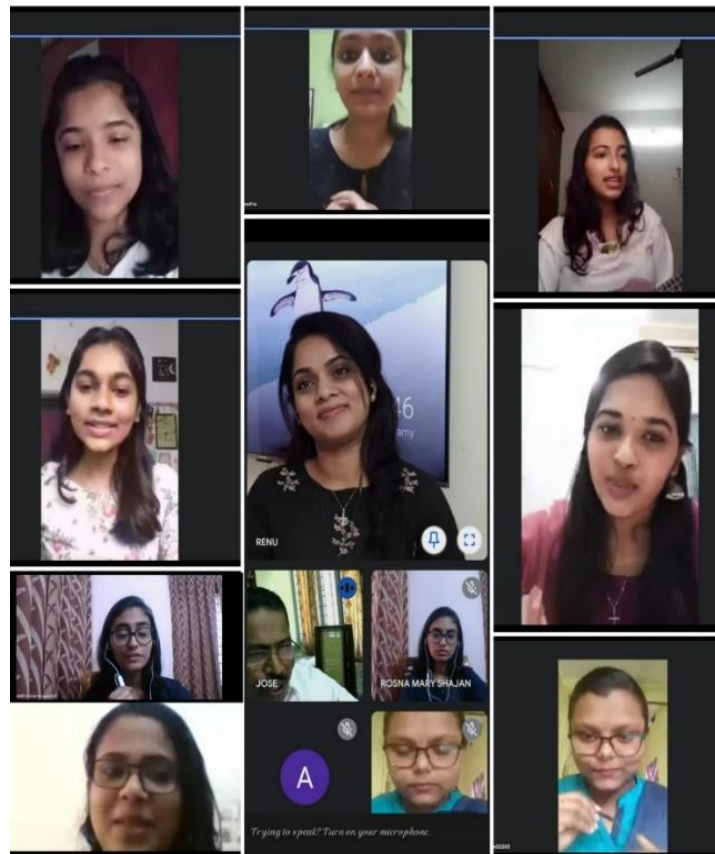

Dhanya Varma, Journalist and Host of The Happiness Project**

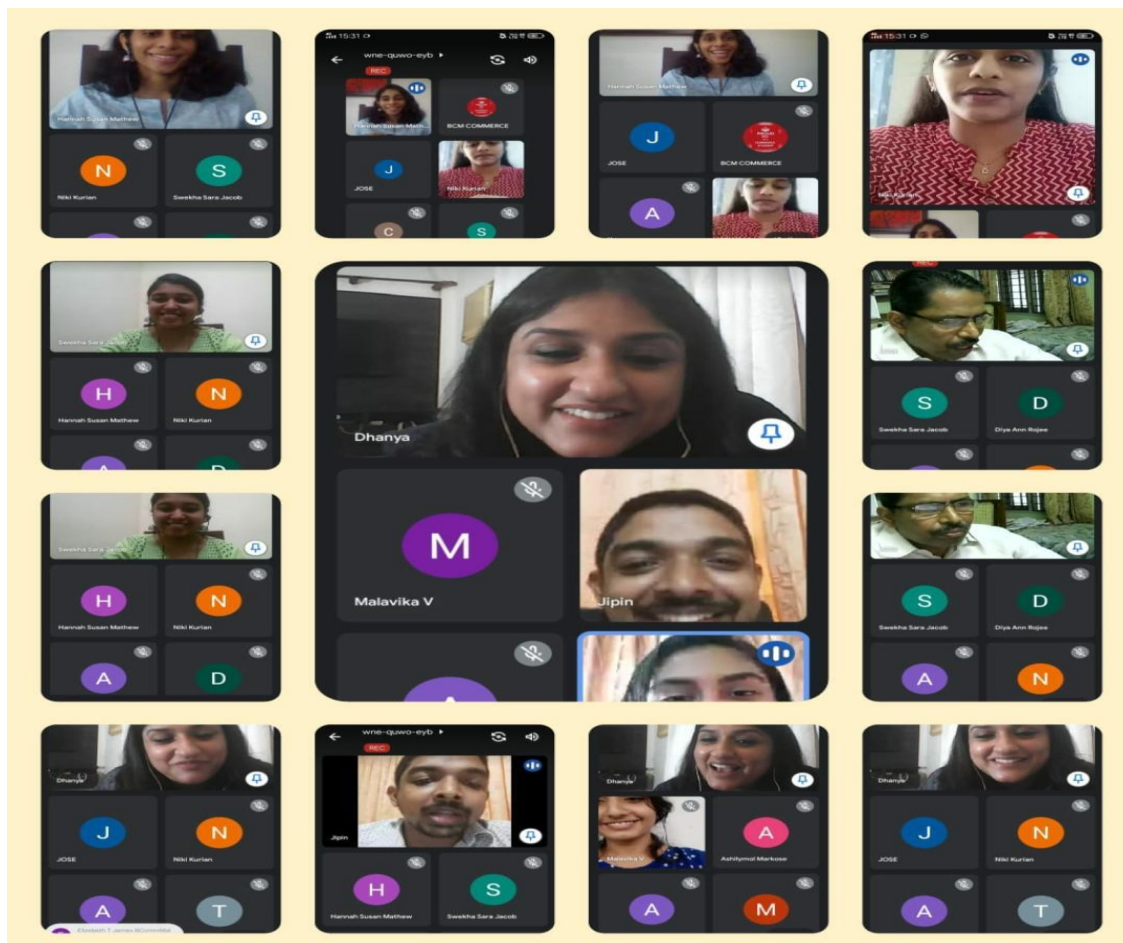

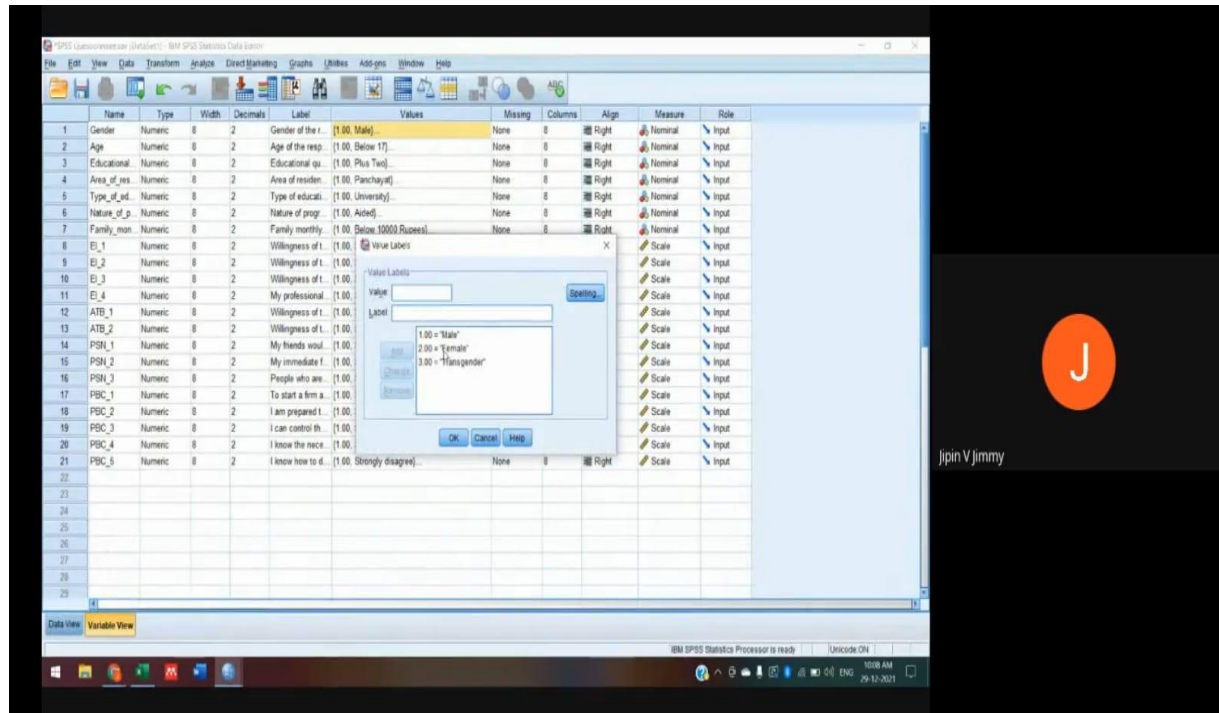
4. OTHER

meet. He presented his screen and showed us all the steps from entering the data to finding out results needed for the analysis.



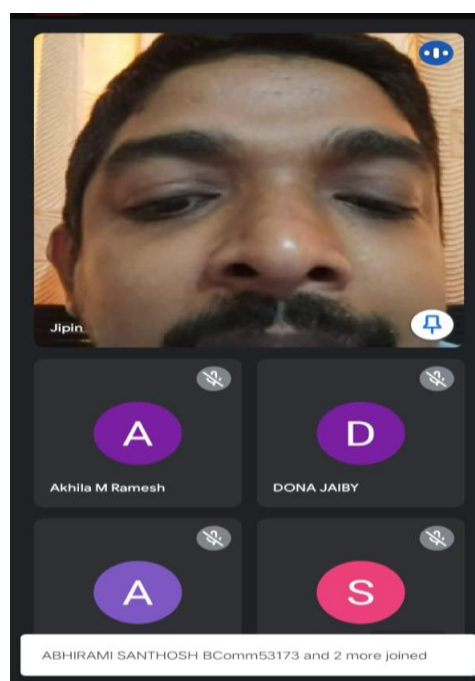
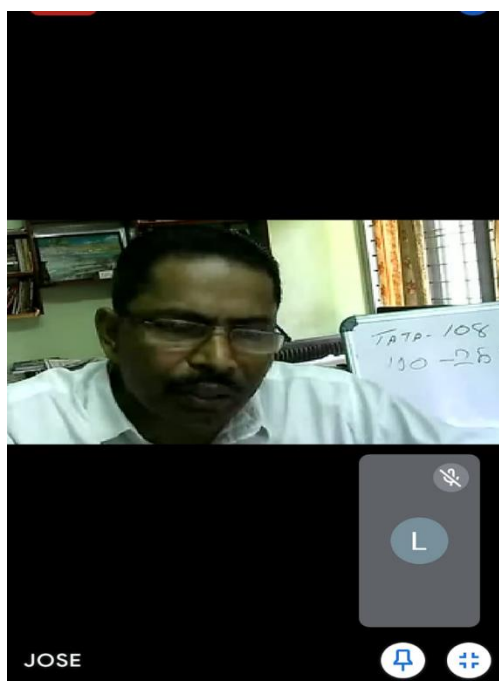
b) INTRODUCTION TO STOCK MARKET

3. TEACHER'S DAY

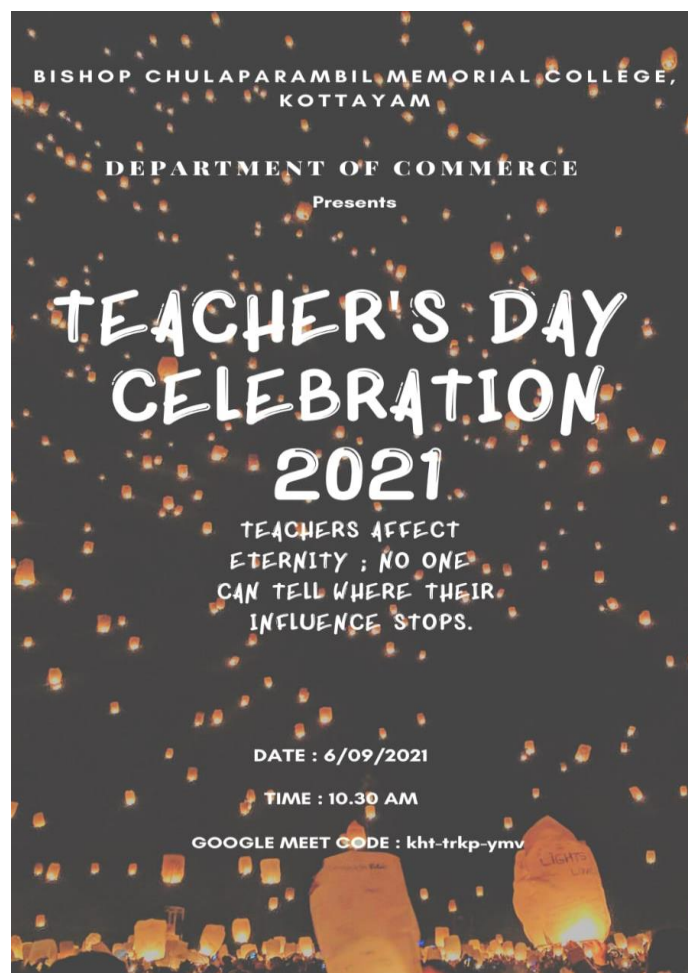
“ Teachers are the reason why ordinary students Dream to do extraordinary things”

On 6th September 2021, the Commerce Department of BCM College Kottayam celebrated teachers day at 10:30 am through Google meet.

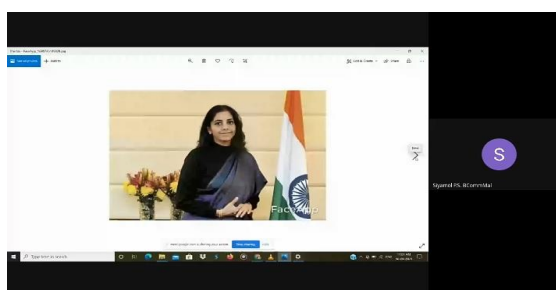

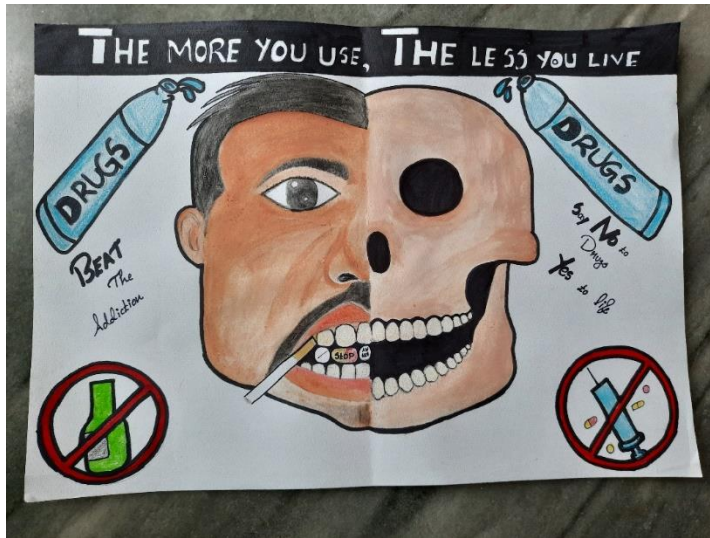

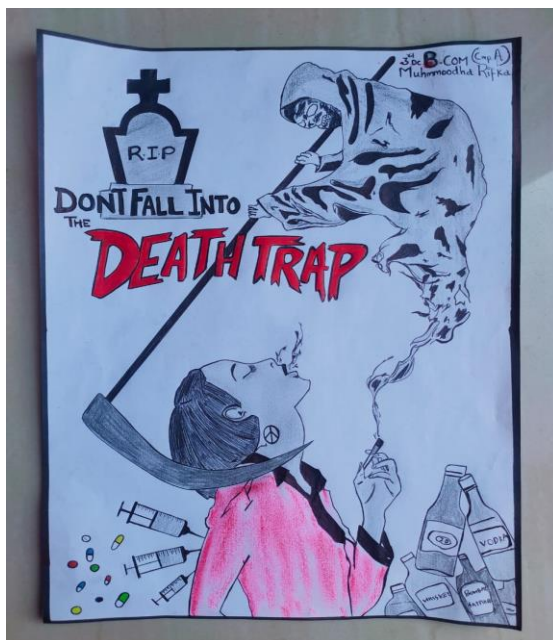

a) CD REUSABLE COMPETITION

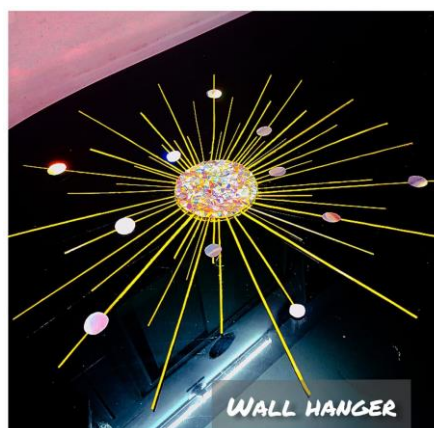
"Live life cleaner by making Earth greener".

(i) Is It A Good Move To Include Petrol And Diesel Under GST



The department of commerce always encourages students to use power point presentations.

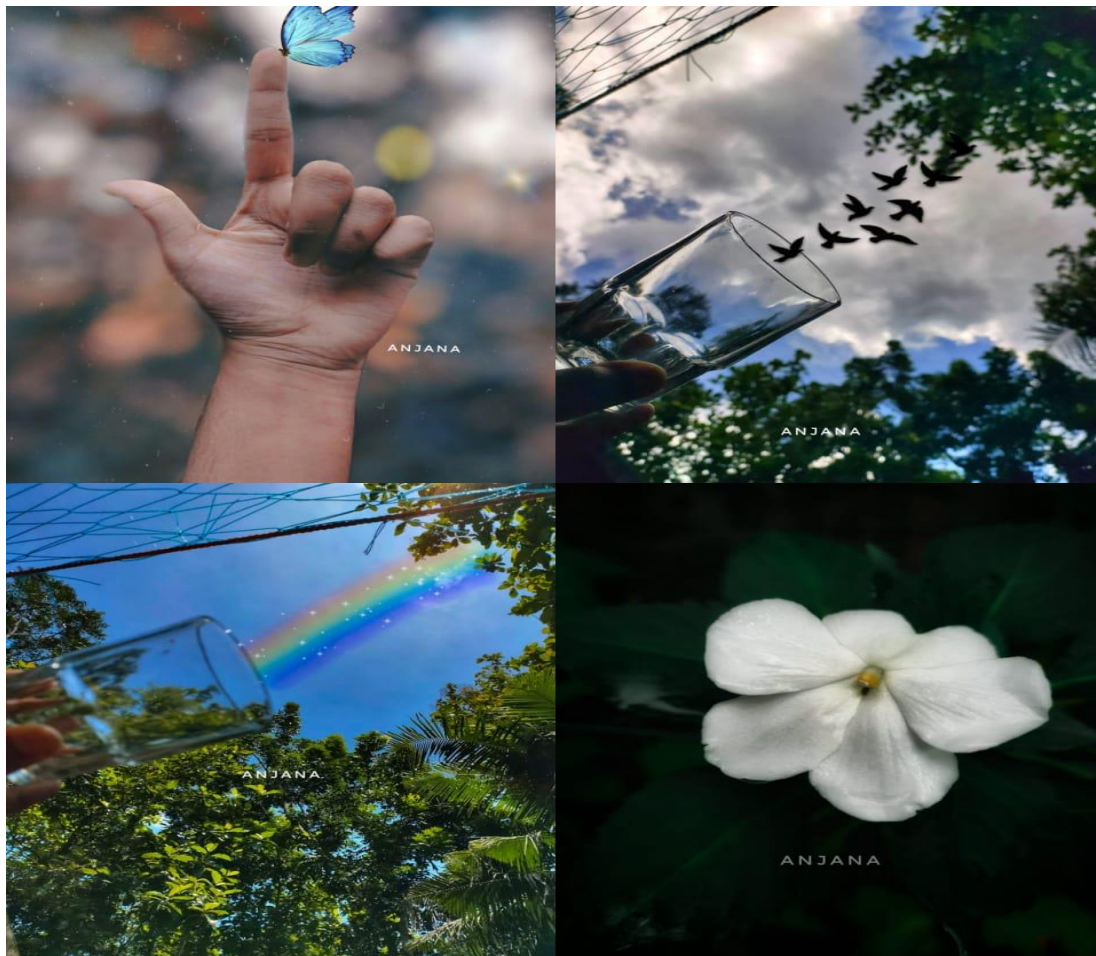

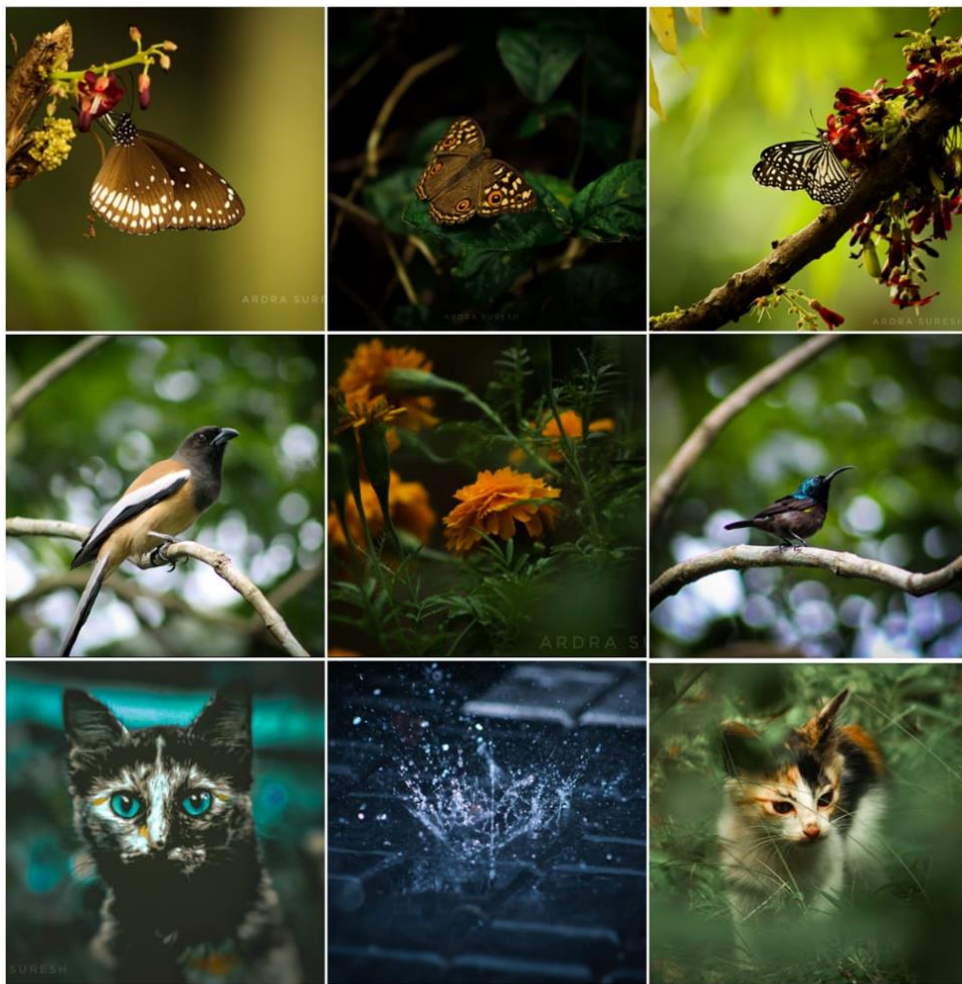

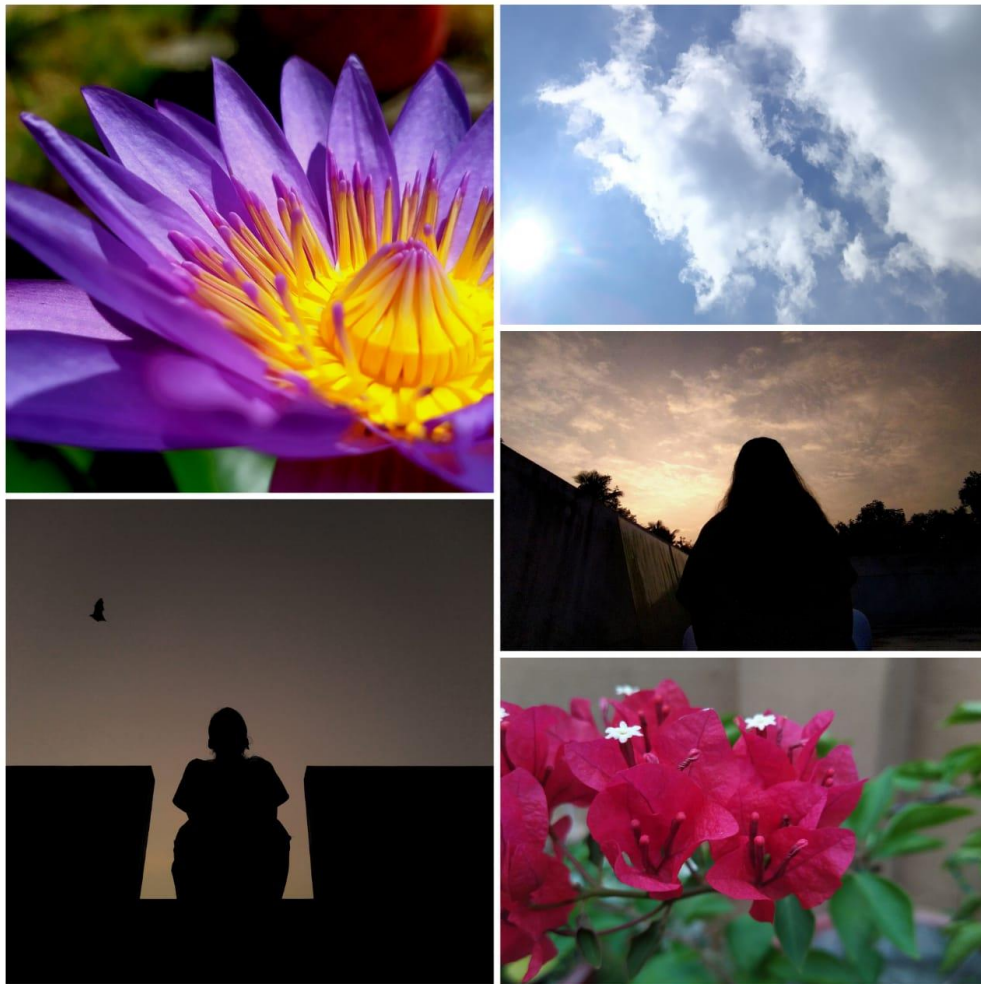

2. LIFE SKILL PROGRAMS

a) Swayam- Deposit Scheme

A recurring deposit is a special kind of term deposit offered by banks which help people with regular incomes to deposit a fixed amount every month into their recurring deposit account and earn interest at the rate applicable to fixed deposits. It is similar to making fixed deposits of a certain amount in monthly instalments. This deposit matures on a specific date in the future along with all the deposits made every month. This theoretical knowledge put into practicality through this system every year.

The students of Commerce Department has initiated in opening a recurring deposit account. The main aim of this initiative is to maintain an account for the purpose of gathering money for their final year entertainment tour. Both the first year and second year students maintain the account for the sake. The idea of recurring deposit helps them to utilize their money for a worth purpose as they are getting an interest rate on the money deposited.

The interest rate received through the account helps in reducing the amount of money collected from the student, as they receive interest on the amount deposited, even though interest amount won't make any huge difference. It is also helpful for the students to save money for a purpose. Through this initiative the textbook knowledge received by them is made into practice.

The idea of starting a recurring deposit account is to help them in both guiding students

This provided the students with the practical knowledge of how to record data and to keep both soft and hard copies of them.

This deposit scheme was also carried out this academic year as well even during the covid -10 pandemic. Students contributed according to each ones capability and helped in raising rupees 6500 every month. The RD finally matured on November 23rd with which all the students went on a one day trip, and those with extra money used them for attending various competitive exam.

The students of 2dc B.Com taxation were requested to be presented in the language

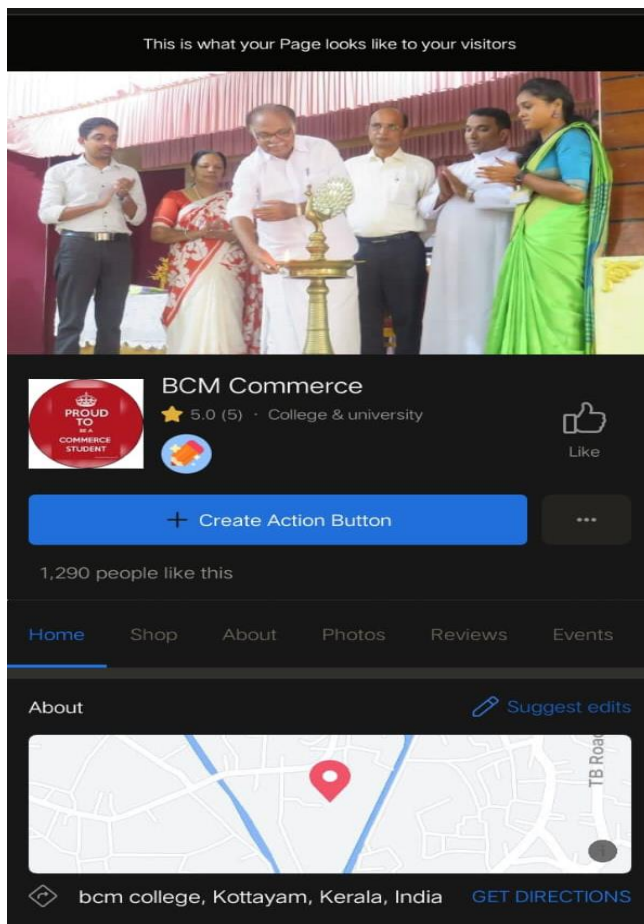

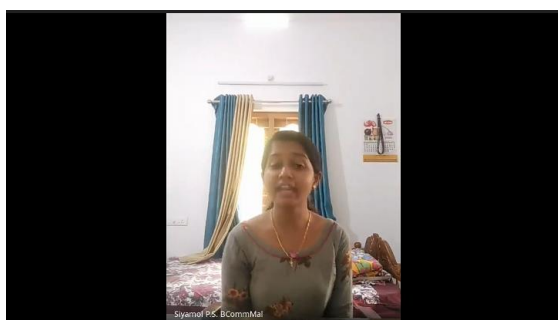
(iii) HOW FAR CAN INDIA BE RATED IN FIGHTING COVID-19

"The more we can break the rules, The better of we're going to be" this is a famous quote by the famous women entrepreneur Indira Nooyi. I don't think there is a much more relative sentence with which I can relate my journey so far. Facing all the setbacks and mentall paralyzing now I've accomplished what I wanted to be. From learning from each and every failures then and now I've been able to built my dream and also to ignite at least a dozen mind. Introducing myself I am Gouripriya N P (3rd year B.com) and this is all about the journey I've been through in building my dream.

"Delicious destiny" is the name of my start up. It is a home baking initiative based on online page on instagram. It includes birthday cakes, pastries, deserts, and other allied products. We deliver the product on door step anywhere around the city and utmost importance is given to the safety of the customer due to the prevailing pandemic condition. It was all a vague idea at the beginning and it formed a shape of which it is now is only because of the uncompromising support of my family and friends. At my younger age itself I had an urge inside me to step up out of the comfort zone and to do something in my own initiative. It all started at the time of lockdown but the starting was not at all based on a long term basis.

It was just an abortive attempt. Initially I shared the idea with my family and they pledged me complete support and freedom to pursue my dream. At first as a business startup I had to invest in some capital at the beginning. At the initial stage I put in ₹20,000 into business. And purchased some essential assets. As for most of the

entrepreneurs mistakes was my teacher. From every order I learned something new and in the next I tried to cope up with that mistake and after some months I've been able to minimize my cost and get the full utilization of my props. Initially as a beginner I had to find my market so I relied mostly on the online promotions through whatsapp, instagram it helped to create a good impression of the page among the viewers. And due to the excellent promotion in the initial stage finding a spot in the market was not at all a heavy task. Also the mouth to mouth promotion of the experienced customers had a big role in the promotional level as well. As I got good promotion it was now the pricing which i had to focus. Penetrating pricing is which I followed. As there are many other home bakers available in every nook and corner of the city i had set a lower price at the initial stage and then gradually increased the price. It worked out well!... customers where very pleased with price and the product. After the infancy stage the business slowly started to expand and it was now necessary for me to make some important decision.

As I've said before the start up was just intended for a short term basis but due to customer reactions and the emotional satisfaction I've got I decided to extend it. And invested much more capital to innovate the equipment which would help to ease the job like designing and also increase the quality as well. Slowly, i got back the money invested and now any more revenue I earn would be my profit. And thus from the beginning till this time i earned approx. ₹80,000 - ₹85,000 turnover. Also to add up the drawing portraits was also moving well at the same time.

Drawing was my passion from my childhood onwards. Paid works of drawings had been there even before the home baking initiative started. but was not so well organised. 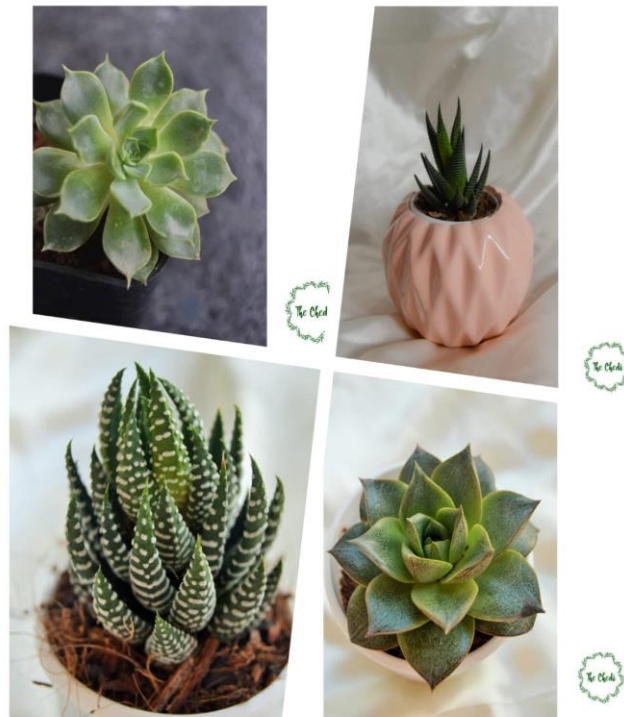
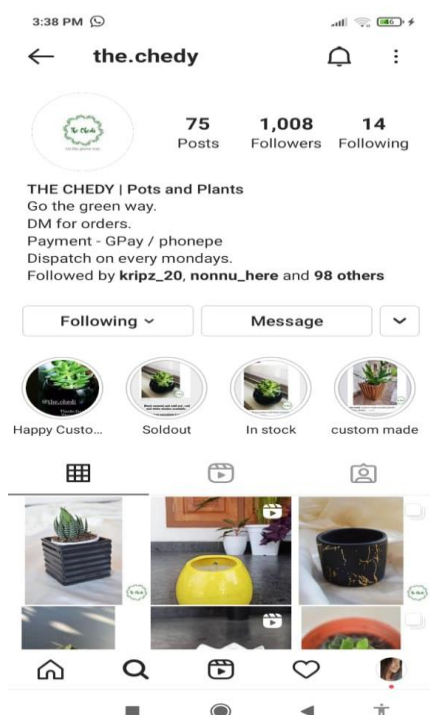

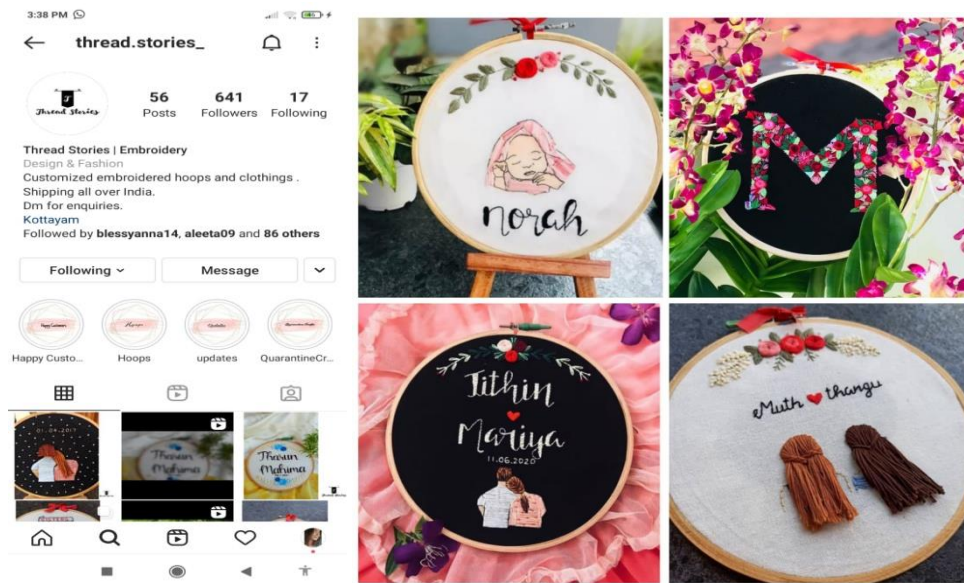

When you consider the barrage of rape cases that are reported in the media every day and the fear that resides in every woman, Devi makes you feel even more helpless.

The movie is set in a single room occupied by many women, Devi is the story of perseverance. The film opens with a few women who seemingly belong to different worlds but are all stuck in the same room – but why? The story unravels in the next 13 minutes as we get to know the trauma that they have suffered.

Written and directed by Priyanka Banerjee, Devi is an empathetic attempt to show that no matter the age, caste, religion and class, female rape victims are all stuck in the same purgatory. Be it the God-fearing woman (Kajol), or the deaf-dumb girl (Yashaswini Dayama), or even an older lady (Neena Kulkarni) – these women are different from each

other but suffer the same fate. As they watch the news on television, they learn that their little room will have more occupants with each passing day.

As we meet characters played by Neha Dhupia and Shruti Haasan, and even a medical school student, played by Shivani Raghuvanshi, it is further established that no two rape victims have anything in common. They all come from different worlds but to men, they are nothing but prey.



Priyanka Banerjee has tried to tell an effective story in a span of 13 minutes, and she hits hard towards the end as we see a little girl walk into the room. Given the state of women's safety in the country, the subject is strong but the execution, not so much. The first few minutes are surely intriguing, but as each character starts opening up about their trauma, you know what's coming next.

The film's purgatory is suggestive of the 1,00,000 pending rape cases in Indian courts. The end slate talks about the irony of worshipping Goddesses in a country where crimes against women have only gone up in the last few years. Devi leaves you feeling sorry for the state of women in India.

After the presentation of the movie, 10 minutes were allowed to the students for discussion on the content of 'Devi'. After that, from the student section Siyamol P S came forward to share her thoughts and she delivered a review on that movie.

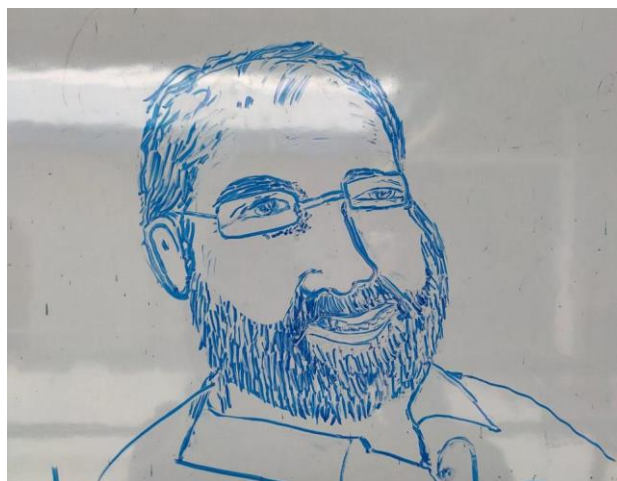

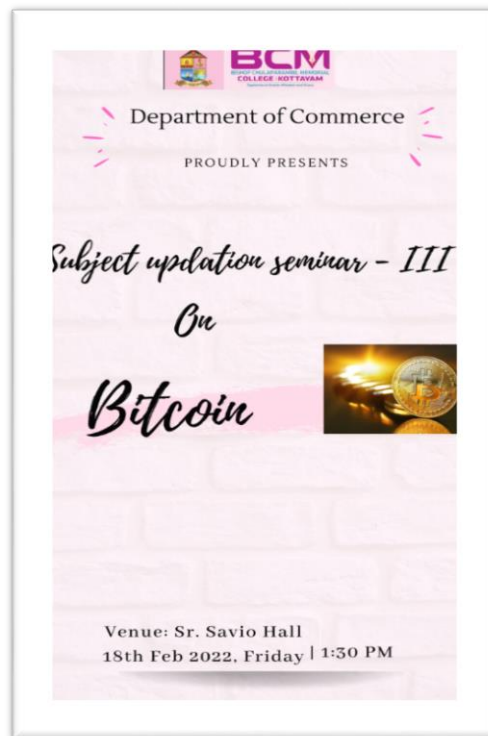

Susan Chandy and Ganga from second year M.Com. In the programme we discussed about

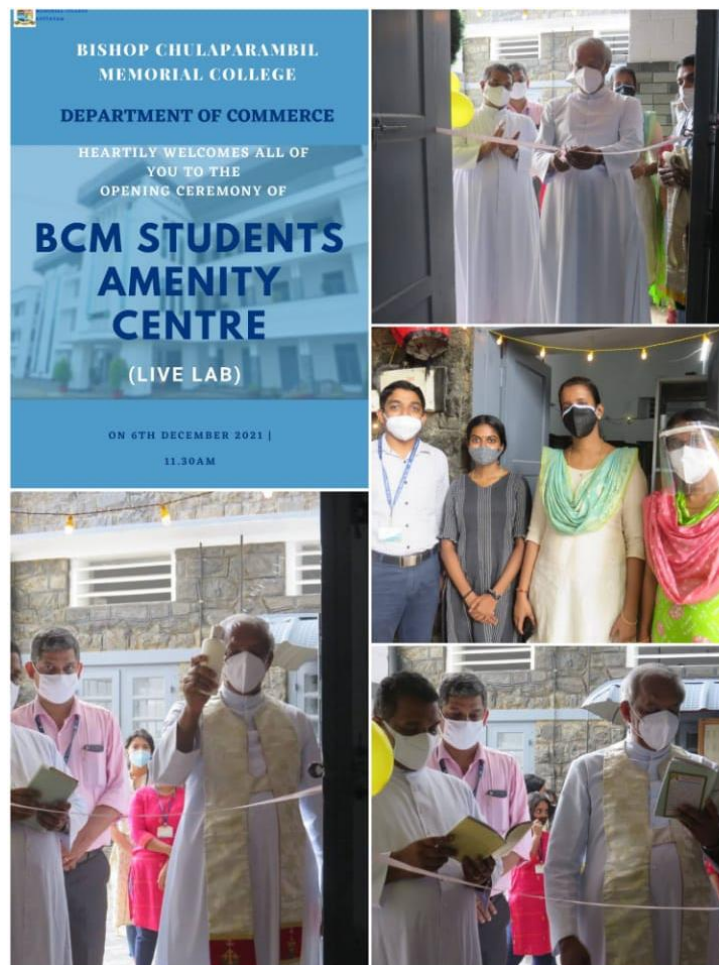

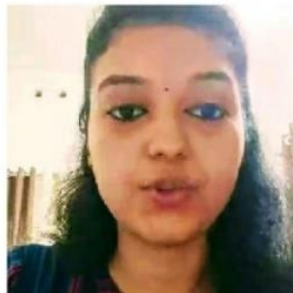

Rajive who is the resource person for CDSL IPF (Investor Education) , Chief Executive of Invision Consulting, Executive Director of Vibha Vani India and vice chairman of National Innovation Foundation. He has over 22 years of industry experience, holds MBA , Diploma in Training and Development, and has certifications in financial markets by NCFM, AMFI and IRDA. He is working as a Management consultant in enterprise strategy and OD training for the last 8 years. He conducted more than 1000 investor awareness programmes in the last 18 years.

He started the session with the basics of Investments and Depository Services and the effect of technology in the financial industry which makes people aware about things happening.

CDSL is the Indian Securities Depository Institution which was founded in 1999 and it holds various securities like shares, bonds etc. in an electronic format. He mentioned that only a small proportion of the total percentage of population has entered into the field of Capital Market on which the entry point is starting a Depository Account . NSE had established an Investor Protection Fund with the objective of compensating the claims of investors. He then mentioned about inflation and steps to overcome through investment and explained the process of investing, saving and spending.

He mentioned about the great investor Warren Buffet by quoting his words “Do not save what is left after spending ; instead spend what is left after saving ” . Then he said about things to be kept in mind before joining the financial industry and there was an interactive session where students were able to ask questions and get cleared. 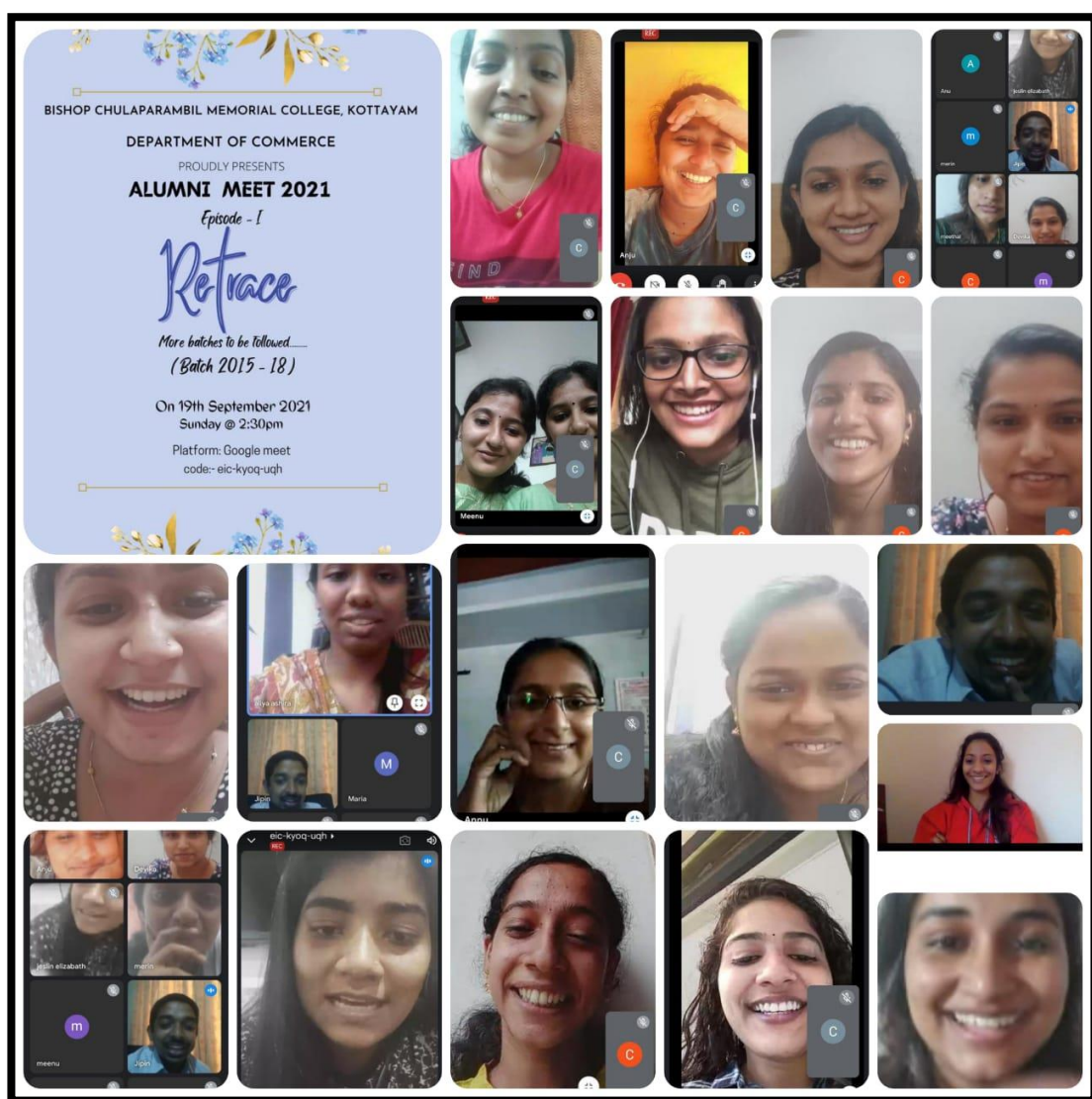

“College is a place where moments become memories; memories remain forever in our hearts.”

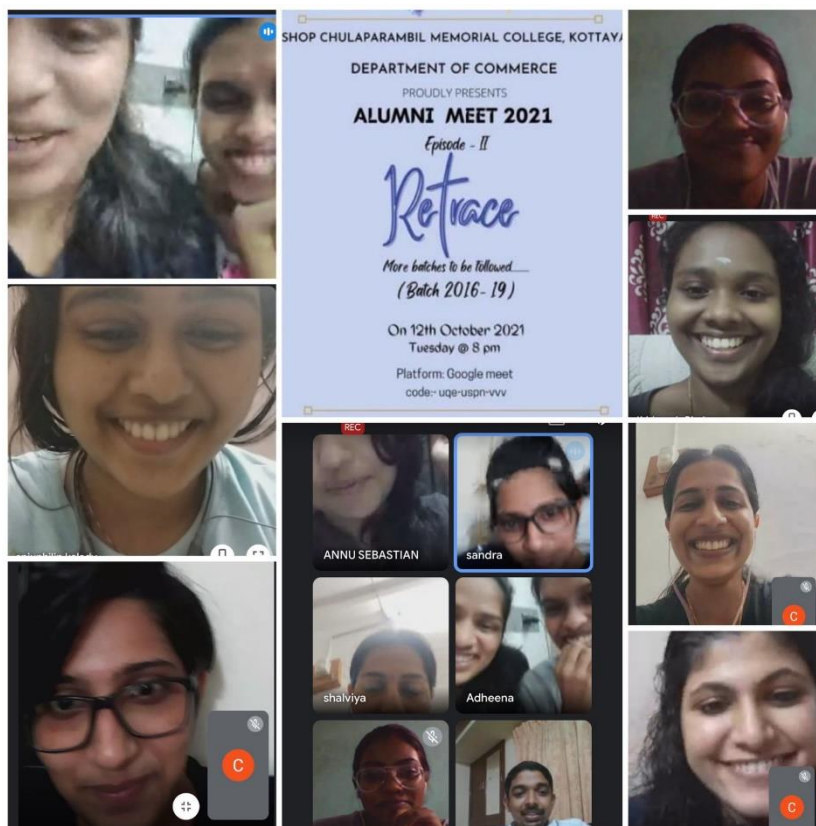

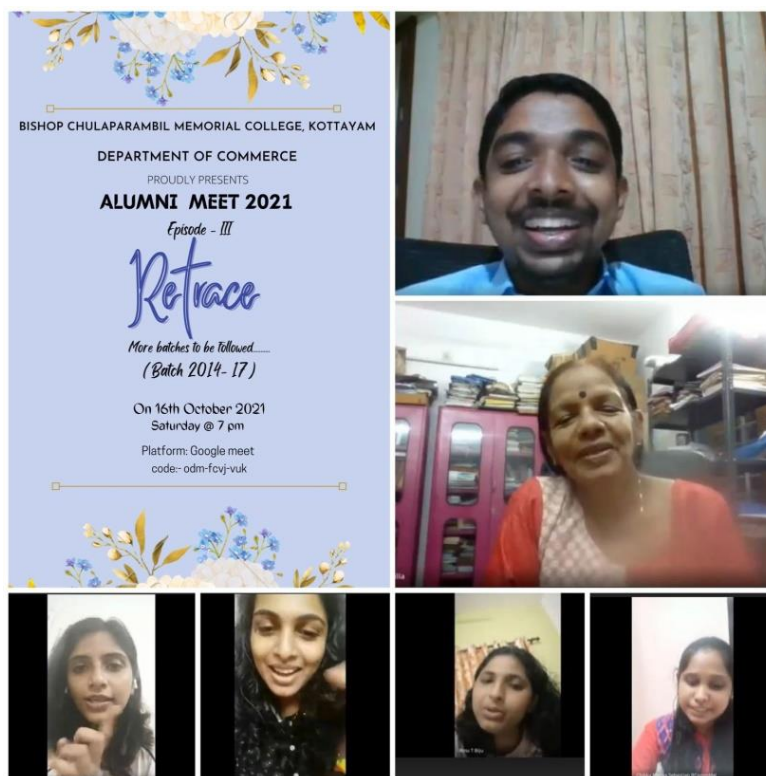


EPISODEs 3:

Second World War actually it has been said so by the western media .It is not the World Economic powers that is affected but the poor countries like Libya which depends on Ukraine for its import of food items. The inflation created is not because of the disruption of supply but because of the hoarding done by the oil suppliers in the name of the war. US inflation which leads to price rise has happened much before the war and investors in anticipation of decline in the value of the currency started to invest in gold. This is the reason for the stock market crash .Regarding India it is the high time to attain self-sufficiency or aatma nirbhar bharat which itself is a moto of present government .Even the price rise for rubber has helped domestic farmers. Actually the war is between US and Russia where Russia wants to prevent US from establishing its military base and nuclear weapons in the name of NATO in the Ukraine which is near to Russia .To avoid this threat Ukraine had been used as a battleground in order to show that this is not the reason behind the wall the western media is giving news totally in favour of them.

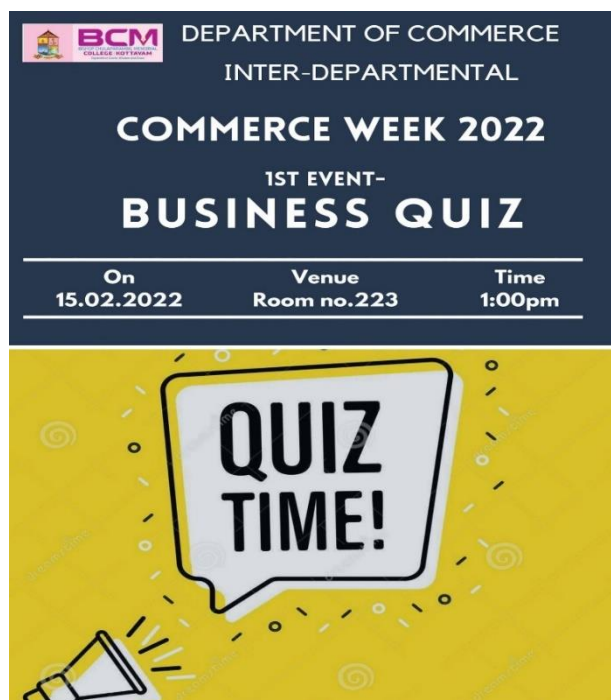

College, Kottayam has conducted Onam celebration virtually in a grand and traditional manner.

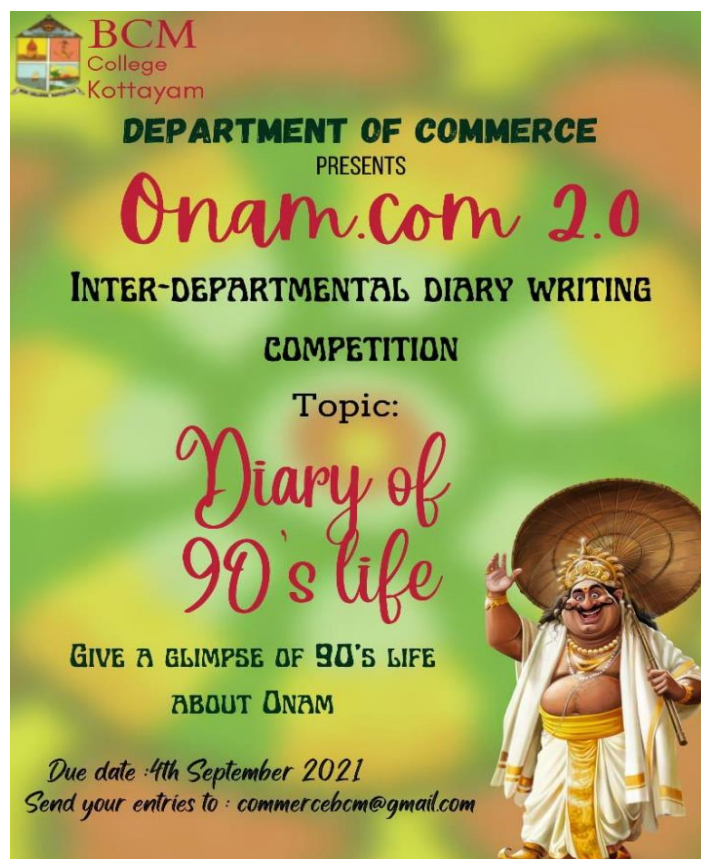
MEME- MAKING COMPETITION

XXI. EXTENSION AND SOCIAL SERVICE ACTIVITIES

1. ACADEMIC EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Apart from the seminars, workshops and interactive sessions that are arranged throughout the year, there is also other activities that are done to give the students an opportunity to explore themselves. It also helps them in discovering various talents and at the core they help them in learning certain theoretical aspects more quickly and thoroughly. These are the academic extension activities. This year we conducted the following activities.

a) EARN WHILE YOU LEARN

it was a program initiated by one of the dear teacher of commerce department, Dr. Reshma Rachel Kuruvilla. She started this program for all year students with an objective let the students learn what is taught more thoroughly and also to earn a small pocket money, so that the nee don't depend on their parents for petty cash. This program was one were only few students were selected depending upon their academic skills and financial requirement. Around 5 to 6 students from each class was chosen. This scheme was that the students were to correct the answer sheets of their friends. It seems like a simple task but at the same time it helped the students in very positive way. Paper correction was for the zero hour or class tests that was conducted once in a week. A small amount of money for each paper corrected was given to students by Reshma miss.

b) SWAYAM DEPOSIT

A recurring deposit is a special kind of term deposit offered by banks which help people with regular incomes to deposit a fixed amount every month into their recurring deposit account and earn interest at the rate applicable to fixed deposits. It is similar to making fixed deposits of a certain amount in monthly instalments. This deposit matures on a specific date in the future along with all the deposits made every month. This theoretical knowledge put into practicality through this system every year.

The students of Commerce Department has initiated in opening a recurring deposit account. The main aim of this initiative is to maintain an account for the purpose of gathering money for their final year entertainment tour. Both the first year and second year students maintain the account for the sake. The idea of recurring deposit helps them to utilize their money for a worth purpose as they are getting an interest rate on the money deposited.

The interest rate received through the account helps in reducing the amount of money collected from the student, as they receive interest on the amount deposited, even though interest amount won't make any huge difference. It is also helpful for the students to save money for a purpose. Through this initiative the textbook knowledge

received by them is made into practice.

The idea of starting a recurring deposit account is to help them in both guiding students in financial management and practicing textbook knowledge in their daily lives.

There is a well maintained ledger book as well as electronically maintained MS Excel sheet. They are all handled by the students who took the initiative in keeping the accounts. This provided the students with the practical knowledge of how to record data and to keep both soft and hard copies of them.

This deposit scheme was also carried out this academic year as well even during the covid -10 pandemic. Students contributed according to each ones capability and helped in raising rupees 6500 every month. The RD finally matured on November 23rd with which all the students went on a one day trip, and those with extra money used them for attending various competitive exam.

C) PAN CARD

PAN is an unique identification link of an individual with the income tax department. It is issued by the income tax department to an individual . it has 10 alphanumeric characters and issued in the form of laminated card. It is not mandatory for students who do not generate any income to have such card but it good to learn the procedure for its issue. Reshma miss of commerce department wanted to impart to the students the skill of generating a pan card with adhaar card, so that they can generate any one who is close or in need of the pan card without going to akshaya centres.

The students of 2dc B.Com taxation were requested to be presented in the language lab by Reshma miss. The aim for us to be presented was to show the students how to apply for a pan card. First, we were advised to log in with a username and password. Then we searched for Online Pan 49A in Google. A page was shown with several other links for application forms. Among them, www.onlineservices.nsd.com was selected. After that a page appeared which was to be filled with information like application type, categories, personal information like name, email id etc and a captcha code that was given. Finally, click submit. The pan card would be done. This was a life skill that every individual got to learn. It also gave access to computers to those who can't and learnt how to use them .



2. NON ACADEMIC EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

C) TRIBUTRE TO NEDUMUDI VENU

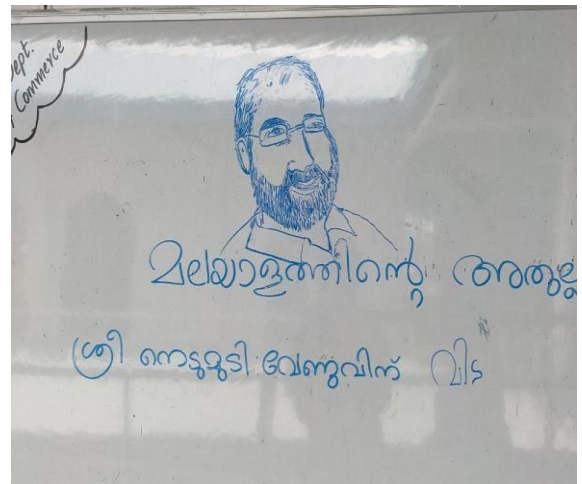
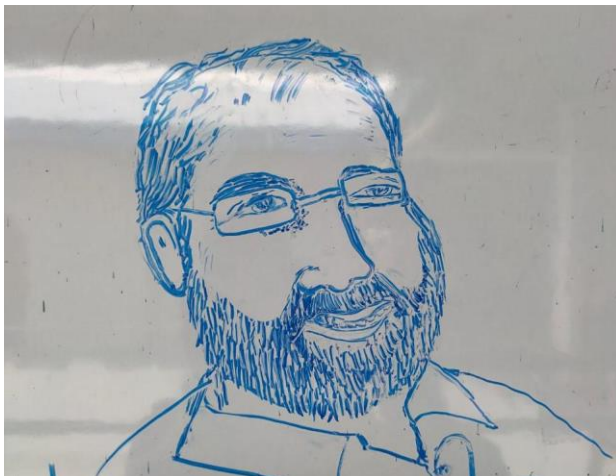

(f) Sent Off Ceremony

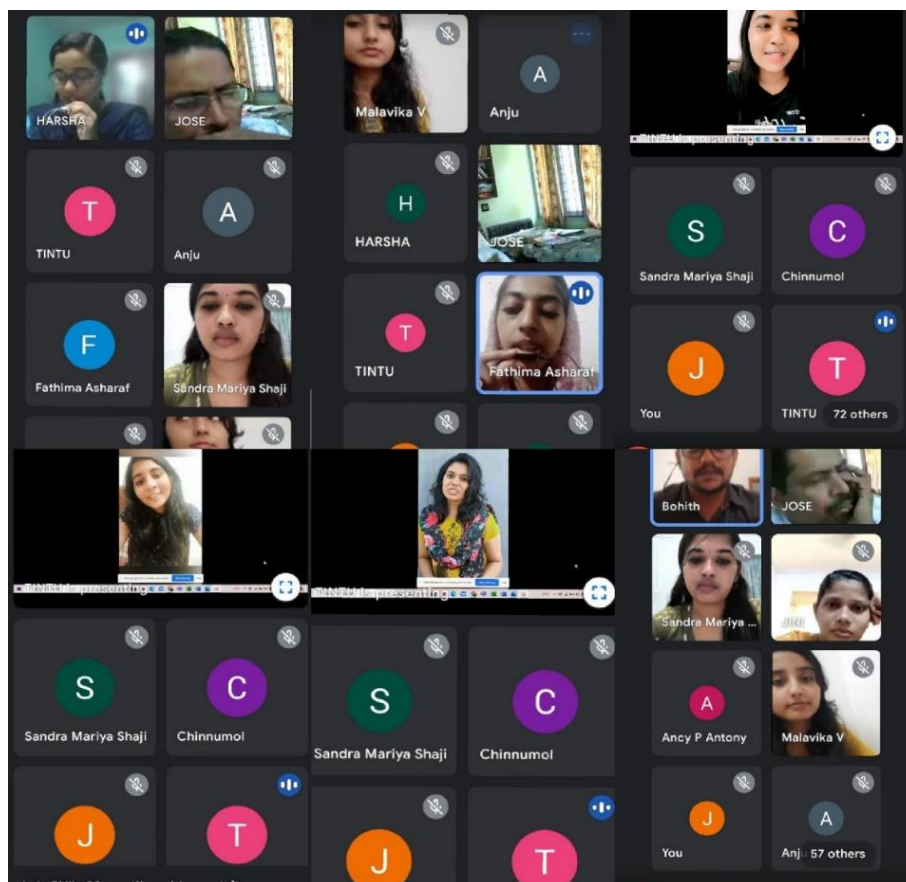

It was followed by an energetic dance performance of the students which motivated the gathering to dance along with them. The songs were remixes of trending Hindi and English songs making the programme joyful.



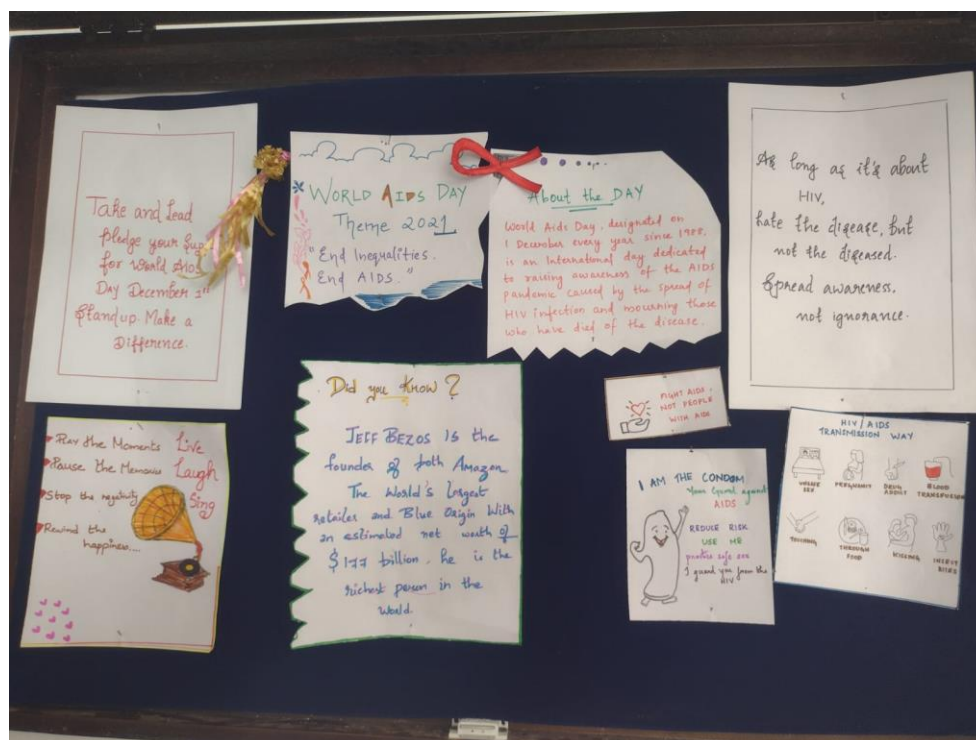

3. SOCIAL SERVICE ACTIVITIES

The Commerce Department of BCM COLLEGE, KOTTAYAM conducted an awareness about HIV/AIDS ,on the World AIDS Day on 1 December .The session mainly focused to unite in the fight against HIV, show support for people living with HIV and remember those who have died. In that awareness we actually understood. World AIDS Day takes place on 1 December each year. It's an opportunity for people worldwide to unite in the fight against HIV, to show support for people living with HIV, and to commemorate those who have died from an AIDS-related illness. Founded in 1988, World AIDS Day was the first ever global health day. HIV (human immunodeficiency virus) is a virus that attacks the body's immune system. If HIV is not treated, it can lead to AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome).



The various HIV symptoms came out with in a few weeks of HIV infection, flu-like symptoms such as fever, sore throat and fatigue can occur. Then the disease is usually asymptomatic until it progresses to AIDS. AIDS symptoms include weight loss, fever or night sweats, fatigue and recurrent infections. There are three stages of HIV infection, Acute HIV infection is the earliest stage of HIV infection, and it generally develops within 2 to 4 weeks after infection with HIV. During this time, some people have flu-like symptoms, such as fever, headache, and rash. In the acute stage of infection, HIV multiplies rapidly and spreads throughout the body.

The virus attacks and destroys the infection-fighting cells of the immune system. During the acute HIV infection stage, the level of HIV in the blood is very high, which greatly increases the risk of HIV transmission. A person may experience significant health benefits if they start during this stage. Chronic HIV Infection, The second stage of HIV infection is chronic HIV infection (also called asymptomatic HIV infection or clinical latency). During this stage, HIV continues to multiply in the body but at very low levels.

People with chronic HIV infection may not have any HIV-related symptoms. Without ART, chronic HIV infection usually advances to AIDS in 10 years or longer, though in some people it may advance faster. People who are taking ART may be in this stage for several decades. While it is still possible to transmit HIV to others during this stage, people who take ART exactly as prescribed and maintain an undetectable viral load have effectively no risk of transmitting HIV to an HIV-negative partner through

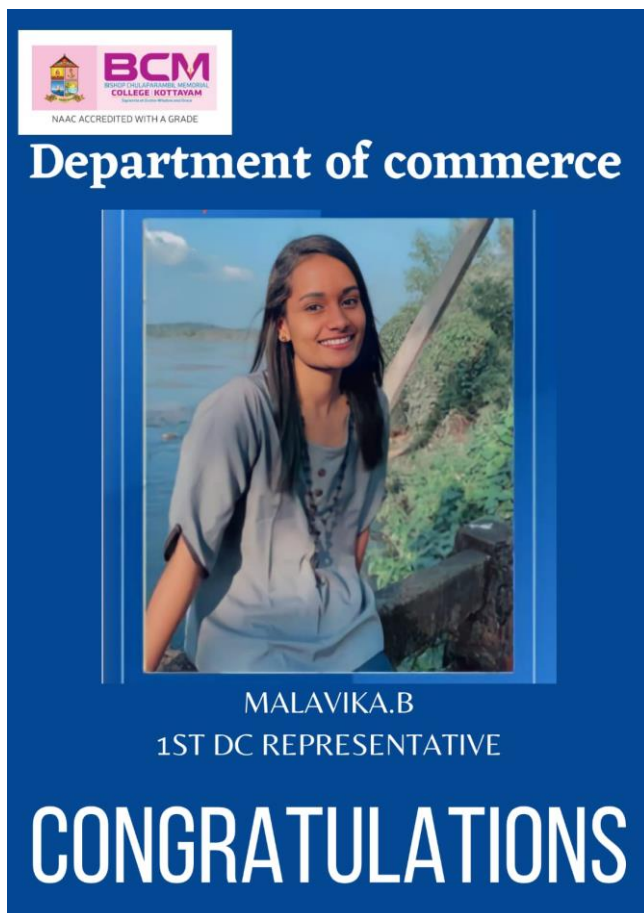
sex. AIDS is the final, most severe stage of HIV infection.

No cure exists for AIDS, but strict adherence to antiretroviral regimens (ARVs) can dramatically slow the disease's progress as well as prevent secondary infections and complications. This session made us to know about HIV virus, Symptoms, Complications And Also The Preventive Measures.. So it was truly an informative session. The department actively participated in spreading awareness and believes that the future generation has the ability to sensitize others and prevent spread of HIV. 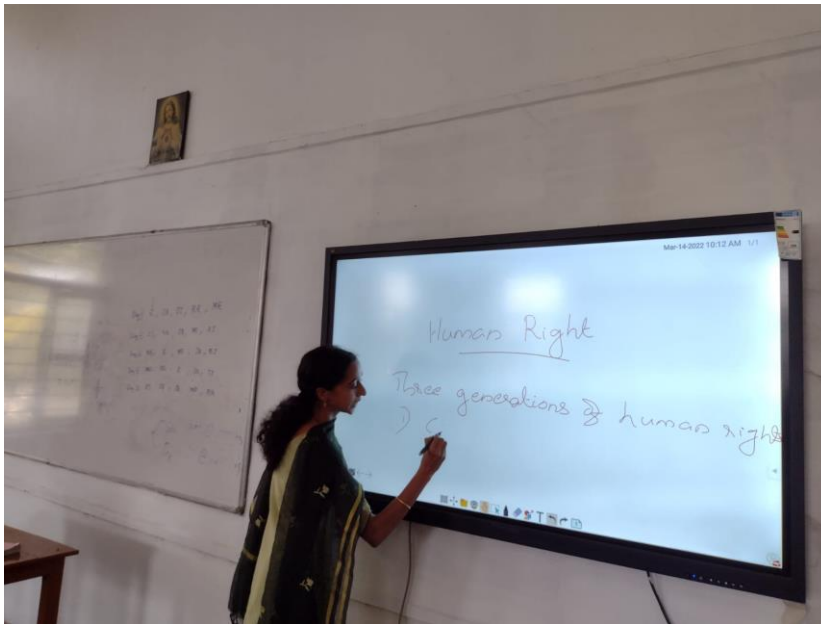

They also pointed that this gender neutral uniform debate is just for schools.

This is a conversation that needs to happen in workplaces across the world too. Both schools and workplaces should be open, inclusive and tolerant environments where everyone can be proud of and celebrate their Authentic Selves. A safe space where you can bring All of who you are to work and school. No hiding, no masks. Showing up as the real and true you.

Debater from team B said that gender neutral school uniforms may seem like a good idea, but as one school has found out, forcing everyone to wear trousers doesn't really work. She pointed that freedom of expression works both ways. While steps are being taken in the right direction in terms of girls having the choice to wear trousers or knee-length shorts what about if boys want to wear skirts or dresses. If gender norm conformity is to be fair and schools wish to be more inclusive boys and girls

should have the choice to wear trousers, skirts, shorts, dresses according to their identity.

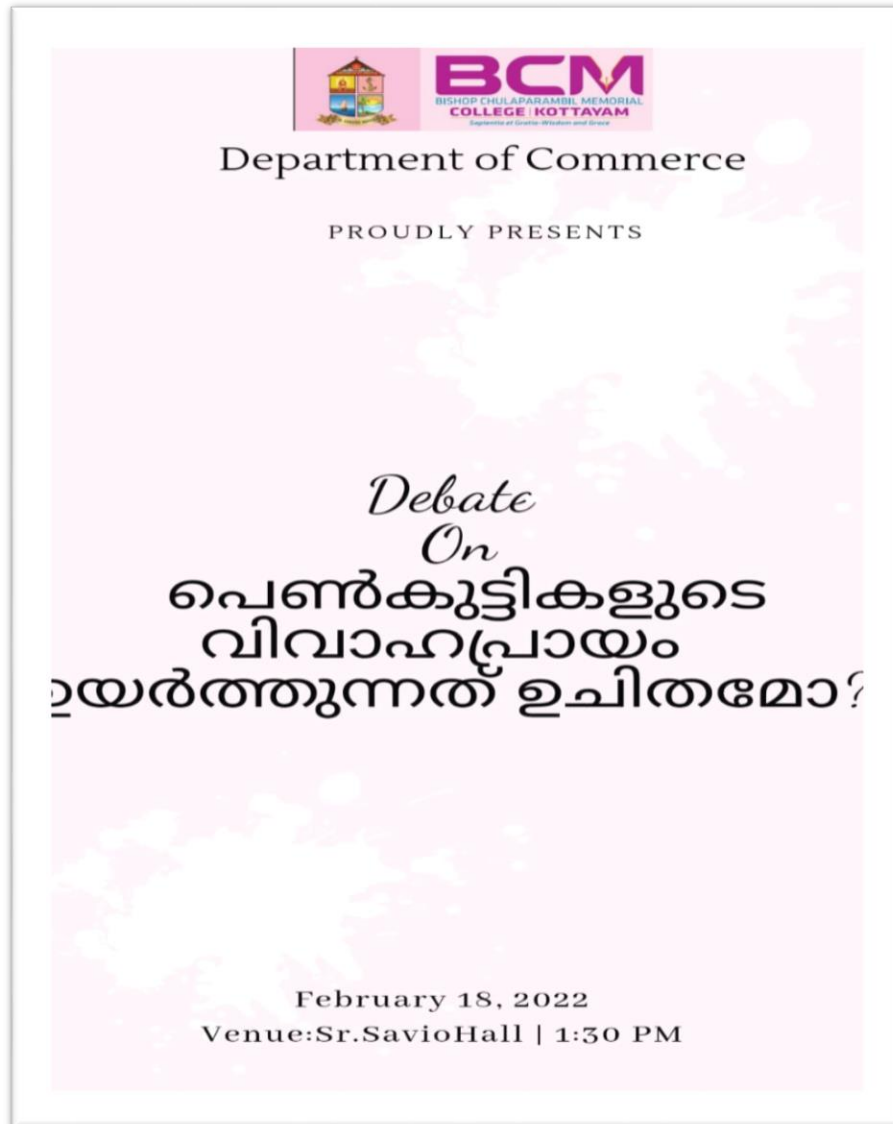
Uniforms can be seen as a way to restrict the sexualisation of girls (rules on hems of skirts, no shoulders). Uniforms take the focus away from sexuality and focus it on academics in a school setting for girls. In conclusion, students said that it is very essential to have gender neutral uniforms to bring equity and abolish discrimination among men and women. A student from the audience explained her difficulties she experienced for a long time due to gender discrimination and gender discrimination uniforms. She also said that she was always so excited when she had PE, because she could wear her PE uniform for the whole day,” she said. “In the PE uniform she wasn’t restricted when she played and she didn’t show my undergarment when she was bowling at cricket. She was always much happier when she could wear pants to school.” The moderator concluded by saying that gender neutral means neither male or female.

It would help abolish the separation between male and females and would give a message that all human being should move ahead in the same direction. A gender-neutral uniform is not about forcing students to wear a different ‘neutral’ style of uniform. It’s about offering more choice with items that avoid distinguishing roles according to gender.

3. DISCUSSION ON INCREASE IN AGE FOR MARRIAGE
