### **Annual Report 2021-2022**

Bishop Chulaparambil Memorial College celebrates the 67<sup>th</sup> Annual day in the academic year 2021-2022. Bishop Chulaparambil Memorial College has adorned everyone with wisdom and grace and has successfully re-shaped their destinies, making them strong women of today.

The college was established in the year 1955 by Mar Thomas Tharayil, who made the visionary zeal of his predecessor Bishop Chulaparambil a reality and liberated the women of South India from the patriarchal mores of the then society by establishing a college for the young women of the Knanaya Catholic community.

If the decades before had been about Bishop Chulaparambil Memorial College empowering girl students, 2020, the last year of the decade has produced liberated young women, no longer hesitant to speak up for their rights and fully ready to go that extra mile for themselves, their Alma Mater, their families and for the larger world. On the sixty fifth annual day, we can proudly claim that we have brought in changes within the teaching-learning activities with Outcome Based Education, a student-centric method.

#### **Academic year**

The college reopened after summer vacation on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2021 via online due to the pandemic and offline classes were resumed from October 4<sup>th</sup> 2021. The academic year 2021 – 2022 was a blessed year for the institution. The students and teachers got the opportunity to come back and take class in the classrooms after a year of online class. First semester classes began on September 27<sup>th</sup> 2022. The total strength of the college is 621 students. There are 100 teachers in total. There are 35 staff in the unaided section and 65 in the aided section including Permanent staff and Guest lecturers. Four new teachers were appointed- Ms. Philcy Philip, Dr. Dona Elizabeth Sam, Ms. Nisha Mary Peter in the English Department and Ms. Delta Kurian in Economics Department. There are 25 non teaching staff at the College. Notification inviting applications for 14 teaching positions and 2 non-teaching positions was published in March 2022.

We have 12 UG Aided programmes, 3 PG Aided Programmes, 4 Self Financing UG Programmes and 5 Self Financing PG Programmes. All the Courses are Outcome Based Education and Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is followed.
