








Kargil Vijay Diwas












Brief Report -





The department of Sociology on 4th December ,2022 organised a webinar on the topic 'Relevance of Constitutional Values Today', the webinar started at 8pm and it was led by








"Is Gandhian principles still relevant today?

A debate was conducted on October 4, 2022, at 12:00pm, as part of Gandhi Jayanti Week. The debate topic was – "Is Gandhian principles still relevant today?". Around 23 students participated in the debate and it was chaired by Assistant Professor Dr. Reeja P S. The affirmative spoke about the pertinence of Gandhian principles, especially the ideals of non-violence or ahimsa. They upheld Gandhi as an altruistic leader who led the nation's independence movement through an idea unheard of, back then – 'Ahimsa'. The supporters of Gandhian principles passionately argued about the prominence of the Gandhian virtues, especially in the current scenario, where another world war seems to be only a stone's throw away. They also argued about how Gandhi remain an influential figure throughout history. The other side, tried to counter all the claims of the affirmative. For instance, the negative argued that Gandhi's attitudes to women were complex and contradictory. They talked about

how Gandhi opposed contraceptives or birth control pills and regarded all sex as "lust" and stubbornly advocated self-control or restrain to regulate sex, during his conversation with Margaret Sanger, the American birth control activist and sex educator, in December 1935. The negative also called the principle of ahimsa an outdated one. The debate session concluded by around 12:50 pm. In the end, everyone agreed that certain Gandhian principles remain important while there are others which ought to be shunned. The debate was indeed informative and vibrant and the students felt rejuvenated.


