A robust legal framework supports children's rights, with legislation such as the Juvenile Justice Act, POCSO Act, and the Right to Education Act, all aiming to protect children from harm and promote their development. These laws contribute to a fairer, more just society where every child can thrive.

Social workers play a vital role in child protection and need a deep understanding of current systems to propose improvements.
